- A. Three-Legged Stool
 - Regulations (Statutes & Codes)
 - Administration
 - 3. Enforcement
- B. Regulations, administration, and enforcement are all part of the equation.
- c. Effective administration and enforcement are necessary to ensure there is compliance with regulations.

- Administration and Enforcement Programs
 Need to Match the Culture and Resource
 Capacity of the Community.
- E. A Measured Approach is the Best Practice
 - A. Don't go too far, too fast.
 - Strike a balance between too much, and not enough.
 - c. Small incremental steps.
 - characteristic reference of the administration and enforcement program.

F. Types of Enforcement Programs

- Complaint-based code enforcement.
 - What constitutes a bona-fide complaint?
 - Oral?
 - Written?
 - Anonymous?
- Systematic code enforcement.
 - Block-by-block, parcel-by-parcel, or town-by town.
 - b) Windshield survey (identify apparent violations).
- 3. Other???

G. Typical (Complaint-Driven) Situation

- Investigation.
- 2. Inspection.
 - Voluntary.
 - Special inspection warrant.
- 3. Communication.
 - a) In person or by phone.
 - b) In writing.
- 4. Documentation.

5. Violation(s) found to exist.

- a) Notice and opportunity to correct.
 - Oral Communication (in-person or by phone).
 - Follow up with a warning letter to each violator, identifying each violation, any necessary remedial measures, deadline to attain compliance, and consequences if fail to do so.
- b) If all violations timely corrected, document via letter, and remember to say 'Thank you.'
- c) If all violations not timely corrected...go to 6. 8. below.

- 6. Citation(s)
 - a) monetary penalties only ... no injunctive relief.
 - b) one violation (a single day)
- 7. Summons and Complaint
 - a) monetary penalties
 - each day of continuing violation may (depending on code language) constitute a new violation
 - c) injunctive relief
- 8. Post-Judgment Enforcement Action
 - a) Contempt
 - Remedial Sanctions
 - Punitive Sanctions

H. Violations that Require Immediate Action

- 1. <u>See</u>: E. 1. − 4. Above
- 2. Letter
- 3. Cease and Desist Order
- 4. Summons and Complaint
- 5. Temporary Injunctive Relief
- 6. Post-Judgment Enforcement Action
